Cat · Male · Third Dinner Confirmed · Near Amendment 21

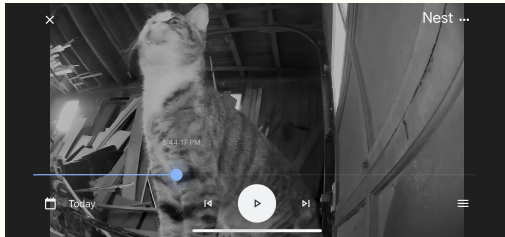


Exhibit A — local barn, near Amendment 21, 5:44 PM.

Person of Interest: Orange Tom, Catalpa Rd.

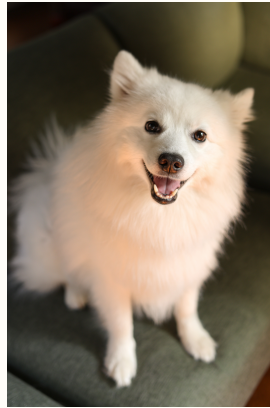
Cat · Male · Orange · Front Paw Limp · Whereabouts Unknown
